Seeing the Mystery of the Person and the Charter for Healthcare Workers

Daily in my work as a nurse, I encounter challenges to seeing truly—to seeing another

human—my neighbor in need. I place a blood pressure cuff on a patient's arm, slip an oximetry device on a finger, a digital thermometer under the tongue, all while I sit near a computer checking lab values and charting on line. All the devices register a quantitative number, and the presence of alarms beeping and lights flashing are in fact a reality, a reality that needs perspective. I am aware of another Presence. Sometimes the number is high, sometimes it is low, but through faith I know none of these numbers can measure or even fathom the heart and soul of the person "made in God's image."

The reality of modern healthcare and science *is* to measure and look for quantitative ways to find out exactly what is causing the disease, and then find a way to help the patient "safeguard, recover and better the state of his/her health." (Pontifical Council for Pastoral Assistance to Healthcare Workers, *Charter for Healthcare Workers*. Boston, MA: Pauline Books and Media 1995 §3 pg. 19) And so radiologists, neurologists, and others healthcare workers are trained to peer into MRI and CT

scans of various body parts for numerous reasons, and yet they cannot measure or fathom the mystery and beauty of the human person and soul. What the Charter says to healthcare workers is to see this mystery of the person, not to eliminate the technology. "Technical possibilities must be measured against ethical lawfulness, which establishes their human compatibility, that is, their effective employment in the protection of and respect for the dignity of the human person." (Charter for Healthcare Workers § 44 pg 52.)

In other words, the reason for the technology in healthcare—human life—is more precious than the technology itself. This why *Curatio ex Corde Christi, Apostolate of Catholic Healthcare workers* was formed: to stand squarely with the church in healthcare, to live and act as leaven in witness to Christ, and to defend a culture of life. As healthcare professionals we strive to grow in our relationship with Christ in daily prayer and grace through the sacraments centered on the liturgy of Mass. We encounter Jesus there and wish to follow him daily, trusting he is walking ahead of us even into the hospital or clinic twenty-four hours a day. We understand the inherent dignity of the human person, as one created by God, and through prayer, we ask for the strength, the virtues, and the character to strive for holiness in the midst of our work caring for the sick.




