Retreat Reflection November 2023

The Gift of a Retreat

I have no doubt God orchestrated my introduction to Curatio five years

ago. He gently nudged me to this amazing group of healthcare professionals and led me to their annual Fall Retreat. I signed up and that Friday at work, there was a discussion of weekend plans amongst co-workers. I shared that I was going on a silent retreat. This resulted in a response something like, "Oh wow, really? It's silent? All weekend?... I couldn't do it." Looking back now, maybe I also thought I couldn't do it. How could I get away? The demands of time for family, housework, kids' sports, you name it... it's easy to justify saying no. Interestingly, the first thing to come off our busy to do list is probably something having to do with being alone. Who schedules that? Can we say, "selfish"? We have been conditioned to think this, but time away is not necessarily selfish. This especially is not the case when you spend time alone with God. This time with Him will restore and renew you to stay intentional in your work in cooperation with God's plan for you.

At this years' Fall retreat, Fr. James Brent started off by guiding us through a beautiful meditation. He asked that we close our eyes and envision Jesus standing before us. Between ourselves and Jesus, an empty box lay open on the floor. After several minutes of gentle nudging to put our many distractions into the box, Fr. Brent encouraged us to think specifically of all our to-dos, all our worry, sadness and anxiety, and place them in this box, seal it and set it aside. Fr. Brent was setting the stage for a fruitful three days on retreat. This weekend was about us and Jesus. Everything in that box can wait he said. It's that simple.

After five years of going to the Fall Retreat with Curatio, not one retreat has been unsuccessful. I have learned that along with packing your watch to ensure you make all of the conferences on time, your bible and journal to dive deeply and introspectively, you bring along your willingness to be uncomfortable. By writing down all of the hard questions, the recurring sins, the day-to-day struggles, conscious and unconscious thoughts, bringing them with you to confession and spiritual direction offered by the retreat master is something you will not regret. This intentional time will offer you the spiritual growth you need to say "yes," and continue to say "yes," to our Lord.

The only trouble you might have on a retreat is leaving one.

Acclimating again to radical connectedness and the noise of the world after so much peace can feel jarring, but you will be abundantly fed, and that is something you will be glad you made time for. In the end, a deeper connection with God isn't something you can just pay for or send someone else for. It is something you intentionally say "yes" to and make sacrifices for. And what a gift it is to offer yourself as a sacrifice.

The prayer below was shared by Fr. Brent. He suggested to pray this at night on your own, slowly, and purposefully. May it bring you peace.
